1.1 Current Trends

- General Social Survey of the University of Chicago's National Opinion Research Center
- They tracked drops in religious affiliation and church attendance for > 40 years
 - o **21%** of adults No religious affiliation (2014)
 - 8% in 1990
 - o 5% in 1972
- Pew Research –

Alan Cooperman, Pew's director of religious research, said it's indisputable that the number of self-identified Christians is declining in the U.S.

The Culture of the 60's

In the second half of the decade, young people began to revolt against the conservative norms of the time, as well as remove themselves from mainstream liberalism, in particular the high level of materialism, which was so common during the era.

This created a "counterculture" that sparked a social revolution throughout much of the Western world.

It began in the United States as a reaction against the conservatism and social conformity of the 1950s, and the US government's extensive military intervention in Vietnam. The youth involved in the popular social aspects of the movement became known as hippies.

These groups created a movement toward liberation in society, including the sexual revolution, questioning authority and government, and demanding more freedoms and rights for women and minorities.

The Underground Press, a widespread, eclectic collection of newspapers served as a unifying medium for the counterculture.

The movement was also marked by the first widespread, socially accepted drug use (including LSD and marijuana) and psychedelic music.

Crime

The 1960s was also associated with a large increase in crime and urban unrest of all types.

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Between 1960 and 1969 reported incidences of violent crime per 100,000 people in the United

States nearly doubled and have yet to return to the levels of the early 1960s.

Large riots broke out in many cities, such as Chicago, Detroit, Los Angeles, New York City, Newark, Washington, D.C. and Oakland.

By the end of the decade, politicians such as
Richard Nixon and George Wallace campaigned on
restoring law and order to a nation troubled with the
new unrest.

Read 2 Chronicles 7:13–15 (NIV)

13 "When I shut up the heavens so that there is no rain, or command locusts to devour the land or send a plague among my people, 14 if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land. 15 Now my eyes will be open and my ears attentive to the prayers offered in this place.

4.1 God Gives A Conditional Statement.

- A. If ... Then ... A condition is set.
- B. When that condition is met, then the results take place.
- C. If the conditions are **not met**, there is **no result**.

B. .. THEN ... Forgive their Sin

a. He'll break down the walls that hold back revival.

1 John 1:9New International Version (NIV)

9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.

- b. He'll cleanse our hearts.
- c. He'll **restore** the **joy** of the **church**.

C... THEN .. Heal their Land

- a. He'll send revival.
